Senate bill entitled "An Act to authorize the Mayor, Counselor and Aldermen of the city of Annapolis to issue bonds to the amount of one hundred and twenty-one thousand dollars to pay off the present floating indebtedness of the city of Annapolis, and provide a fund for the permanent improvement of said city."

Was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Senate bill entitled "An Act to make a State subscription to a work entitled 'First Citizen and Antilon—a History of Governor Eden's Administration,' containing the full text of the letters of Charles Carroll of Carrollton, and Daniel Dulany, in the controversy in 1770-1773, arising upon the attempt of Governor Robert Eden to revive, by proclamation, Acts of the Legislature that had expired by limitation."
