ANNAPOLIS, MD., Feb. 19th, 1900.

Honorable John Hubner,

President of the Senate :

I have the honor to return herewith without my approval, Senate bill, chapter 14, entitled an Act to permit the United Railways and Electric Company of Baltimore to increase its board of Directors from the present number, to-wit: nine (9) unto eleven (11), and to provide that of such number two (2) may be citizens and residents of States other than the State of Maryland, because on consideration I have concluded that it requires a change in its phraseology so as to give it greater certainty.
