Whereas, Senator Wilkinson voted for Senate bill entitled "An Act to repeal section 43 and section 44 and section 45, of Article 18, of the Code of Public Local Laws, entitled 'Queen Anne's County,' sub-title 'Centreville,' and to re-enact the same with amendments; and

Whereas, he has since found that said bill contains a provision requiring a property qualification to enable a person to vote at municipal elections in said town of Centreville, which provision is in his judgment repugnant to his ideas of the rights of citizens of this State; and
