BILLS—THIRD READING.

Senate bill entitled "An Act to declare the sanction and consent of the General Assembly of Maryland, to the several deeds made by Samuel Appold and wife, Gabriel D. Clark and wife, and William Kammerer, to the trustees of St. Mark's English Evangelical Lutheran Church of Baltimore, a corporation duly incorporated under the laws of the State of Maryland, and also to the acquisition hereafter by the said grantee of the fee-simple title to any lot of ground mentioned in said deeds in which it has thereby acquired less than a fee-simple, and to the selling, mortgaging, leasing or other disposition thereof."
