

NIGHT SESSION.

WEDNESDAY, Feb. 21st, 1900.

The Senate resumed session at 8 P. M.

Mr. Rohrback presented a petition from Joseph Hopp and 200 other residents of Frederick county, asking that the Legislature enact no laws appropriating large sums of money to institutions not owned by the State.
