missioners of Anne Arundel county to build a bridge over Curtis Creek, and also to build a bridge over Cabin branch, a tributary of said Curtis creek, and to provide by the issuance of bonds the means of building the same, and making said bridges free for public travel."

"An Act to repeal and re-enact with amendments, sections 740 and 741, of Article 4, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title 'City of Baltimore,' sub-title 'Police Commissioners,' as said sections were re-enacted by chapter 123, of the Acts of 1898."

"An Act to repeal section 21, of chapter 323, of the Act of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at its January session, 1860, entitled an Act to incorporate a company to build a turnpike road from the Georgetown turnpike to the public road leading from Adamstown to Greenfield Mills, and to re-enact said section with amendments, so as to read as follows."

"An Act supplementary to an Act entitled an Act to incorporate the Home of the Aged of Frederich city, passed by the General Assembly of Maryland, in the year 1892, and known as 'Chapter 87,' of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland of that year."

"An Act to add certain new sections to Article 4 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title 'City of Baltimore,' subtitle 'Police Commissioners,' providing for the creation of a Board of Police Examiners for the city of Baltimore, defining and prescribing the duties thereof, and regulating appointments to, promotions, reductions in rank, transfers in and removals from the police force of said city, said sections to follow section 745, and to be designated as 'Sections 745 A, 745 B, 745 C, 745 D, 745 E and 745 F.'"

"An Act to amend the charter and extend the powers of The Maryland Casuality Company."

"An Act to add a new section to Article 52 of the Code of Public General Laws, title 'Justice of the Peace,' subtitle 'Process and Practice,' to be designated as section 29A, and to follow section 29 of said Article."

"An Act to authorize the Board of Police Commissioners of Baltimore city to pension Andrea P. Caldwell, formerly a policeman and clerk of the police force of Baltimore city."
