Senate bill entitled "An Act to repeal and re-enact with amendments sections 678 and 690, of Article 4, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title 'City of Baltimore,' sub-title 'Liquors and Intoxicating Drinks,' as re-enacted by chapter 123, of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1898."

AMENDMENTS PROPOSED.

Amend by striking out the word "out," on line 1, of section 678, and inserting in lieu thereof, "sub-division of this Article."

Which proposed amendment was adopted, and

The bill was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Senate bill entitled "An Act to authorize the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to issue the stock of said corporation to an amount not exceeding \$1,350,000 for the purpose of providing a public lighting plant to supply light to said city, and to the inhabitants thereof, and to authorize the submission of an ordinance for that purpose to the legal voters of said city."
