years his share shall be paid to the guardian of the person of said child."

Add after the word "purpose," in section 1, the words "and the party so paying the wages shall take a receipt therefor, which shall exonerate and discharge him from any and all liability for the same, and if the child or children are under the age of 14 years a receipt from the guardian of the person of said child or children shall have the same effect as though given by the child or children above the age of 14 years,"

Which proposed amendment was adopted, and

The bill was read the second time.

Also, favorably,

Senate bill entitled "An Act to declare the sanction of the General Assembly of Maryland, to a certain gift and bequest to the 'Redemptorist,' a body corporate."

Which was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Also, favorably.

Senate bill No. 186, entitled "An Act to repeal section 9, of Article 24, of the Code of Public General Laws, and to re-enact the same."

Which was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Also, favorably,

House bill entitled "An Act to repeal section 88, of Article 75, of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to 'Pleading, Practice and Process,' as amended by chapter 635, of the Acts of 1890, and to re-enact said section as amended."

Which was read the second time.

Mr. Bouic, from Committee on Judicial Proceeding, reported favorably, with proposed amendments,

House bill entitled "An Act to repeal and re-enact with amendments Article 9, section 46, of the Code of Public General Laws, title 'Attachments, Claimants of Property."
