stituting for the same, after said word "provided," the following: "That this section shall not be construed to confer upon said company any other or grater authority than it had heretofore provided in reference to the use of any of the streets, lanes, alleys or roadways within the corporate limits of the city of Frederick."

Amend said bill by changing word "city" to "county" wherever it occurs in the corporate name of the company.

Amend Senate bill No. 189, by inserting the words "and streets" after the word "roadways" in line 15 of section 2, as amended."

Which proposed amendments were severally adopted, and

The bill was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
