the Code of Public General Laws, title 'Elections,' as reenacted by chapter 202, of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland of 1896, by adding thereto eleven additional sections under the sub-title Corrupt Practices,' to follow section 151 as now enacted."

Which was read the second time.

The question then recurred upon whether or not said bill should be engrossed for a third reading.
