person filing or attempting to file as his own, the diploma or certificate of another, or a forged affidavit of identification, shall be guilty of a felony, and upon conviction, shall be subject to such fine and imprisonment as are provided by the statutes of the State for the time of forgery.

Sec. 2. Be it further enacted, etc., That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

Which proposed amendment was adopted.

And the bill was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
