General of Maryland, or some other person to be selected by the Governor, the agent of the State of Maryland, to collect and recover, in the name of the Governor of Maryland, the balance due, or so much thereof as is collectable; of the claim of the State against the United States Government growing out of the furnishing and equipping of Maryland troops for the Volunteer Army of the United States in the late Spanish-American war, and providing compensation therefor."

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Finance.

By Mr. Rohrback,

A bill entitled "An Act requiring the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad Company to keep a flagman stationed at the crossing of said railroad over the county road at Monrovia, Frederick county."
