Was referred back to Senators Bouic, Williams, of Anne Arundel, and Crothers.

Mr. Applegarth submitted the following message:

BY THE SENATE,

January 18th, 1900.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates:

We propose, with the concurrence of your Honorable Body, the appointment of a Joint Special Committee, to consist of five members, three of the House and two on the part of the Senate, whose duty it shall be to correspond with the General Assembly of Virginia, or committee thereof, for the purpose of having enacted concurrent legislation on the part of Maryland and Virginia, relative to fish and oysters in the Chesapeake Bay and its tributaries.

We have appointed on the part of the Senate Messrs. Applegarth and Wilkinson.
