AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

By Mr. Putzel,

Amend by adding at the end section 4, the following:

"Provided, however, That said corporation shall in all respects be subject to the provisions of chapter 123, of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1896, and all ordinances passed by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore in conformity therewith, and shall be subject to the control in every respect to the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, in so far as its operations may be carried on in the city of Baltimore, and nothing herein contained shall be construed to the contrary."
