date the twenty-ninth day of October, 1898, and recorded among the Land Records of Baltimore City in Liber R. O., No. 1758, folio 466, etc.

Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 731.

AN ACT to authorize the Board of Police Commissioners of Baltimore City to increase the pension of Herman Heimiller, William J. Lowdenslager, John Davis, Jno. T. Kelly, Alexander Slaysman, Jno. A. Walter, Joseph S. Townsend, Ambrose A. Ryan, retired policemen of the police force of Baltimore City.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Board of Police Commissioners for the City of Commission'rs Baltimore be and they are hereby authorized and directed to pay the following pensions to the following officers of the police force of Baltimore City, who have been pensioned heretofore, the respective sums set opposite their respective names, as follows:

Police Baltimore. Authority to pension certain policemen.

To Herman Heimiller, a retired policeman, the sum of nine dollars per week, in lieu of six dollars.

To William J. Lowdenslager, a retired policeman, the sum of nine dollars per week, in lieu of six dollars.

To John Davis, a retired policeman, the sum of nine dollars per week, in lieu of six dollars.

To John T. Kelly, a retired policeman, the sum of nine dollars per week, in lieu of six dollars.

To Alexander Slaysman, a retired policeman, the sum of nine dollars per week, in lieu of six dollars.

To John T. Walter, a retired policeman, the sum of nine dollars per week, in lieu of six dollars.

To Joseph S. Townsend, a retired policeman, the sum of nine dollars per week, in lieu of six dollars.

To Ambrose A. Ryan, a retired policeman, the sum of twelve dollars per week, in lieu of six dollars, who were permanently disabled in the discharge of their duty as such policemen, out of the fund in the hands of said Board of

Disabled in discharge of duty.
