

open to the inspection of the Commissioners and any taxpayer; and he shall, on or before the first day of May in each and every year, render a succinct and detailed statement of his receipts and disbursements for the fiscal year, which shall be posted in at least two public places in said town.

31. The bailiff, before entering upon his duties, shall subscribe to an oath for the faithful performance of his duties for the enforcement of the ordinances of the town and the preservation of its peace and good order; he shall be vested with all the police powers of a constable, and any one resisting him in the discharge of his duties shall be liable, upon conviction, to punishment in the same manner and to the same extent as if he had resisted a constable; and he shall perform all such duties as are or shall be imposed upon him by law, ordinance or by the order of the Board of Commissioners, and he shall pay over all fines and fees that may be collected by him to the treasurer monthly.

Powers of.

32. For the enforcement of the town ordinances any justice of the peace residing in the town of Delmar, and if no justice of the peace reside there, or should the resident justice of the peace be unable or refuse to act, any other justice of the peace of the State of Maryland residing in Wicomico County shall have all the powers of ordering arrests, summoning witnesses, trying cases and inflicting fines and punishments that are now vested in justices of the peace by law, and shall be entitled to receive and demand the same fees as in other criminal cases, and shall, quarterly, pay all fines over to the Commissioners; and the bailiff in enforcing the ordinances of the town shall be entitled to the same fees as are allowed constables in criminal cases under the laws of the State, or any future provisions thereof regulating constables' fees in criminal cases; and from any judgment rendered in the enforcement of the ordinance of the town an appeal shall be by the party aggrieved to the Circuit Court for Wicomico County, provided the appeal is taken within thirty days after the rendering of such judgment, but no appeal shall stay process or execution upon judgments unless good and sufficient bond be given for payment of fines and all costs in case judgment be affirmed.

33. The Commissioners shall have charge and control of the lighting of the streets of the town, and shall have power to contract for lighting the same, to contract with any water company for the use of water in case of fire, for sprinkling streets and other public purposes, to employ all labor, or
