19. They may provide for and take care of all persons suffering from accident, sickness or physical or mental infirm- and disabled. ity, and who are unable to take care of themselves, and, if deemed necessary, may send them to the Alms House of Prince George's County, in which case all expenses so incurred shall be repaid to the Mayor and Common Council of the town by the County Commissioners, who are authorized and required to levy annually such amount as may be necessary for reimbursement thereof, and to issue warrants for such purpose, payable to the Mayor and Common Council of said town.

20. At the election to be held under the provisions of this

Act, on the first Monday in May, 1900, and every two years thereafter, there shall be one person elected as treasurer of said town, who shall possess the same qualifications as the Mayor, to serve for two years, and until his successor is elected and qualified, whose duty it shall be to keep an account of the receipts and disbursements of the corporation in a well-bound book, to be provided by the Mayor and Common Council for that purpose, and he shall render to the Common Council an account of the same each month; before entering upon the duties of his office he shall give bond, payable to the said Mayor and Common Council, in such penalties as they may fix, with sureties to be approved by them conditioned that he will well and faithfully account for all moneys paid over to him by the bailiff of said town, or any other person, and all taxes and other moneys for the use and benefit of said corporation, and that he will also well and truly pay to the order of the said Mayor and Common Council all moneys so received by him and the said bond shall be recorded among the records of the said corporation; and the said treasurer shall qualify and enter upon the duties of his office on or before the first Monday in June succeeding his election, and a failure to qualify within the time herein specified shall be deemed a refusal to accept the office, in which case, as in case of his death, resignation or refusal to act, some person having the qualifications referred to above shall be elected in his place and stead by the Mayor and a majority vote of all the Common Councilmen elected; provided, that at the expiration of the first year of the term of the said treasurer, and before the tax bills for the next year are placed in his hands, he shall make a full and complete settlement of all moneys received by him, and shall report the amount of and return all bills for taxes which are delinquent

and insolvencies, and upon the return of the delinquent tax bills and insolvencies, as provided herein, he shall be relieved
