

it is authorized to consolidate with or lease other railways, and also to build and construct lateral branches not exceeding twenty miles in length.

9. The said company is also authorized to borrow money on its property and franchises, and to issue bonds for the payment of the same by a mortgage of said property and franchises; provided, that it shall not issue any such mortgage bonds in excess of its capital stock.

May borrow money and issue bonds.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 360.

AN ACT to repeal Section ninety-two of Article 5, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Appeals and Errors," sub-title "Appeals from Justices of the Peace," so far as the same is applicable to Allegany County.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Section ninety-two of Article 5, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Appeals and Errors," sub-title "Appeals from Justices of the Peace," be and the same is hereby repealed, so far as the same is applicable to Allegany County," and that the said section shall not hereafter be in force or have effect in Allegany County.

Allegany County. Appeals from Justices of the Peace. Repealed.

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted,* That this Act shall take effect and be in force from the date of its passage.
