192. The Board of Street Commissioners shall appoint regular policemen not exceeding ten, and the said Street Commissioners shall designate one of the number as "chief" or shall appoint "captain," and another as "lieutenant". The said police "captain," and another as "lieutenant." The said policemen shall serve under such regulations and for such compensation as the Board of Street Commissioners may direct, such compensation not, however, to exceed fifty dollars per month for the said "chief" or "captain," forty-five dollars per month for the said lieutenant, and forty dollars per month for the Compensation. other members of the force, and said policemen shall be subject to removal for cause; they shall have power to appoint special policemen if in their judgment the exigencies of the town shall require it; provided, however, that the term of appointment of such special policemen shall not exceed a period of six days. If at any time, for the better conduct and regulation of the fire department of Hagerstown, the Mayor and Council shall provide by ordinance for the office of fire marshal or assistant fire marshal, the incumbent of the said respective offices for the time being, for the more effectual discharge of their duties and the protection of property, shall Fire Marshal. during the time of fires have all the powers of a policeman of the town of Hagerstown, and said marshal and assistant marshal shall take the oath prescribed for policemen of said town, and shall serve without pay.

SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 392.

AN ACT to declare the sanction and consent of the General Assembly of Maryland to the bequest to the Manor Cemetery of Washington County, contained in the last will and testament of William James, late of Washington County, Maryland.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the sanction and consent of the General Assembly Manor Cemeof Maryland be and the same is hereby declared, given and granted to the bequest of five hundred dollars to the Manor Cemetery of Washington County, a body corporate, contained sanctioned in the last will and testament of William James, deceased, late of Washington County, Maryland.
