

## LAWS OF MARYLAND.

Power to  
enact rules,  
by-laws and  
regulations.

SEC. 15. *And be it further enacted,* That this corporation shall be subject at all times to the provisions of Chapters 109 and 279, of the Acts of eighteen hundred and ninety-two, and any amendments thereof.

SEC. 16. *And be it enacted,* That the president, vice-president and directors of said corporation hereby created, shall have power to enact and adopt such rules and regulations and by-laws for the government and management of the affairs of said corporation as they shall deem advantageous to the interests thereof; provided, the same be not contrary to the law of the land.

SEC. 17. *And be it enacted,* That the General Assembly reserve the right to repeal, alter or amend this Act.

SEC. 18. *And be it enacted,* That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

## CHAPTER 493.

AN ACT to repeal Sections 18, 19, 20, 21 and 22 of Article 1 of Public Local Laws, title 'Alleghany County,' sub-title "Birds and Game."

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Sections eighteen, nineteen, twenty, twenty-one and twenty-two of Article 1 of Public Local Laws, title "Alleghany County," sub-title "Birds and Game," be and the same are hereby repealed.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

## CHAPTER 494.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section eighty-one of Article 5 of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Appeals and Error," sub-title "Appeals from County Commissioners."

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Section eighty-one of Article 5 of the Code of Public General Laws of the State of Maryland, entitled "Appeals and Error," sub-title "Appeals from County Commissioners," be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows:
