

limits of the said town as a constable of said Washington County He shall have authority to arrest all persons found by him violating any ordinance of said corporation, or on warrant issued by the Burgess, or assistant Burgess in the absence of the Burgess, and shall be allowed the same costs as constables are allowed for similar services.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 505.

AN ACT to require the County Commissioners of Talbot County to pay annually to the Commissioners of St. Michael's and the Commissioners of Trappe a certain portion of tax levied upon the property within the limits of the town of St. Michael's and the town of Trappe.

County Commissioners of Talbot Co.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the County Commissioners of Talbot County shall pay annually to the Commissioners of St. Michael's and the Commissioners of Trappe a sum of money not exceeding fifty dollars to each out of the taxes levied upon the property of St. Michael's and the town of Trappe, for the purpose of keeping in good repair the main or public roads running through the said towns, and known and described on the plat of said towns, respectively, as Talbot street, in the town of St. Michael's, and Main street, in the town of Trappe.

St. Michael's and Trappe. Appropriation for repair of roads in said towns.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 506.

AN ACT to authorize and empower the Burgess and Commissioners of Boonsboro, Washington County, State of Maryland, to borrow money on the credit of said town for the purpose of constructing or purchasing and operating waterworks in or near said town and to issue bonds for the payment of the cost of the same, and to levy a tax on the assessable property of said town to redeem said bonds and to pay the interest thereon.
