First. To the devise and bequest of certain lands lying and being in Allegany County to James Cardinal Gibbons, Roman Catholic Archbishop of Baltimore, for the time being, and his successors forever, a corporation sole under the laws of this State, contained in the last will and testament of Luther M. Cresap, late of Allegany County, deceased, of record in the office of the Register of Wills for said county in Wills Liber G., folio 169.

To James Cardinal Gibbons.

Second. To the bequest of one thousand dollars to Edward J. Wunder, pastor of Saint Patrick's Roman Catholic Church of Cumberland, Maryland, contained in the last will and testament of Mary M. Soyster, late of Allegany County, deceased, of record in the office of the Register of Wills of said county. in Wills Liber H., folio 5.

To Edward J.

Third. To the two several bequests of one hundred dollars each to Saint Patrick's Roman Catholic Church, of Cumberland, Maryland, contained in the last will and testament Roman Catholical of said Mary M. Soyster, late of Allegany County, deceased.

To Saint Patrick's lic Church.

Fourth. To the bequests of forty dollars to said James Cardinal Gibbons, Roman Catholic Archbishop of Baltimore. for the time being, and his successors forever, contained in the last will and testament of Julia P. Carroll, late of Allegany County, deceased, of record in the office of the Register of Wills of said county, in Wills Liber H., folio 36.

To James Cardinal Gibbons.

Fifth. To the residuary legacy, bequest or devise to Saint Patrick's Roman Catholic Church of Cumberland, Maryland, to be by it used in charity, contained in the last will and Roman Cathotestament of Mary M. Soyster, late of Allegany County, deceased.

To Saint lic Church.

Sixth. To the conveyance, grant or deed dated March 10, A. D. 1898, and recorded among the land records of Allegany County in Liber T. L. No. 85, folio 642, from Richard D. Johnson and others to James Cardinal Gibbons, Roman Catholic Archbishop of Baltimore, for the time being, and his successors forever, of the lot or parcel of ground in the City of Cumberland, therein particularly described.

SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
