CHAPTER 559.

AN ACT to add a new section to Article 75 of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Pleadings, Practice and Process at Law," sub-title "Ejectment," to come in after Section sixty-nine, and to be known as Section 69A.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That a new section be added to the Code of Public General Laws, title "Pleadings, Practice and Process at Law," sub-title "Ejectment," to come in after Section sixty-nine, and to be known as Section 69A, and to read as follows:

Ejectment.

69A. That an outstanding mortgage shall not prevent the real owner as mortgagor of said property from maintaining an action of ejectment against any person or persons other than the mortgagee, or his, her or their assigns.

Outstanding mortgage, etc.

CHAPTER 560.

AN ACT to authorize the Board of Police Commissioners of Baltimore City to pension Louis F. Norris, George W. Bailey and Manno A. Behrens, former policemen of the police force of Baltimore City.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Board of Police Commissioners for the City of Baltimore be and they are hereby authorized and directed to pay the following pensions to the following former officers of the police force of Baltimore City the respective sums set opposite their respective names, as follows: Louis F. Norris, the sum of nine dollars per week; George W. Bailey, the sum of nine dollars per week; Manno A. Behrens, the sum of nine dollars per week, who were permanently disabled in the discharge of their duty
