A petition from Ruth Glaze, of Montgomery county, praying the levy court of said county may be empowered to levy a sum of money on said county for her support, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Swearingen, Mr. Turner and Mr. Riley, to consider and report thereon.

Mr. J. Thomas, from the committee, brings in and delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act to alter that part of the constitution and form of government which requires property as a qualification in voters; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.
