So the amendment as amended was rejected.

The question then recurred and was put, on the adoption of the article; and

Determined in the affirmative.

Mr. Hardcastle, moved that the convention adjourn;

Determined in the negative.

The 31st, article, was then read and adopted.

The 32nd article was then read;

Mr. Parke, moved to amend said article by inserting after the word "that," in the 2nd line, the following:

"Except as allowed elsewhere in this constitution;"

Determined in the negative.

The said 32nd article was then adopted.

The 33d article was then read;

Mr. Ridgely, moved to amend said article by inserting after the word "estate," in the 4th line, the following:

"Or suffer any civil or political incapacity."

Pending the question on this amendment;

On motion of Mr. Spencer.

The Convention adjourned until to-morrow morning 11 o'clock.
