Mr. Todd submitted the following amendment to said amendment :

Amend by adding at end : “Provided, that the expense of such census and registration in each case be met by the owner of such slaves ;”

Mr. Abbott submitted the following amendment to said amendment :

“Sec. —. The Legislature at its first session after the adoption of this Constitution shall provide a mode by which those colored persons who have been liberated from slavery by its adoption shall be registered for the purpose of receiving pro-
 rota any money or other appropriation made by the General Government or otherwise for their benefit.”
