2 DELEGATE JAMES: Any questions, Delegate Raley?

3 DELEGATE RALEY: Delegate Willoner, one of the
4 questions that immediately jumped into my mind is one that
5 there has been some controversy over before: What about
6 welfare rolls and income tax returns?

7 DELEGATE WILLONER: This has language modifying
8 "except as otherwise prescribed by law". At the present
9 time a federal statute requires the welfare records to
10 be kept secret. So this would not be covered, but this
11 provision is not to be operative, it will be covered in
12 the transitory provisions until we pick the very delightful
13 date, July 4, 1970, and this would give the legislature
14 time to take up any problems. So it won't be any problem.

15 We have attached a model statute that we lifted
16 from the Harvard Law Review for those of us who don't like
17 Harvard, perhaps that was a bad choice, but in any event
18 it does show how this kind of problem can be solved by
19 the legislature to protect those areas of privacy.
