2 an area which is spelled out clearly and plainly to prevent
3 the bureaucratic form of government which has been
4 developing in this country to withhold information from
5 the people with respect, particularly, to the way its funds
6 are expended and also from the standpoint of the way its
7 property is handled.

8 This also goes down to the little zoning board
9 and the other administrative bodies throughout the state
10 which have taken upon themselves the right or they have
11 assumed the right to withhold such information as they
12 desired.

13 This was never intended to get into private lives,
14 to get into arrest records, for example, nothing that is
15 not rightly at the present time within the public domain,
16 but only those things which should be given out which
17 are within the public domain.
