

1 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Henderson.

2 DELEGATE HENDERSON: I am opposed to this
3 amendment and I sincerely hope it will be defeated.
4 It provides that a case can be removed as a matter of
5 right, and all that it allows the legislature or the court
6 to do is to fix the time within which the trial can be
7 held.

8 Now that opens all of the abuses, it seems to
9 me, which presently exist in this field, namely, that
10 people who should only have a right to removal upon a
11 showing of cause, that he cannot have a fair and impartial
12 trial, this makes the removal mandatory merely by filing
13 of a piece of paper, and I think it is open to all the
14 objections that have been pointed out in such detail at
15 a previous debate. I hope that this will be defeated.
