

1 1916. No witnesses, and I want to emphasize this fact,
2 suggested that this whole constitutional structure that
3 has been presented by the Majority should be in the Con-
4 stitution.

5 Delegate Wheatley is correct, there were 21
6 hearing dates and 83 witnesses, and the bulk of these
7 people were in educational bureaucracy, but what he did
8 not mention was that virtually all of these witnesses
9 addressed their attention to the language of the Draft
10 Constitution, recommended change in wording here and
11 there, but none, and I repeat, none recommended that we
12 expand this into a nine-section article on the subject of
13 education.

14 This idea, it is submitted, was solely that of
15 the Majority of this Committee and did not represent any
16 part of the testimony of witnesses, much less the bulk
17 of the testimony.

18 Now, the specter of local government article
19 has been raised with respect to local boards, and the
20 Minority feels that this is really the reddest of red
21 herrings, because under the local government article as
