

1 they recognize the damage that this would bring about,
2 and they urge the deletion of Section 8.

3 I will not engage in discussion of -- I urge
4 deletion of Section 7. I will not engage in discussion
5 of Section 8. I think on its face its ambiguity is clear.
6 No State constitution in this State has ever constitutional-
7 ized libraries. We feel there is no need for it, and I
8 think that this explains the position of the Minority
9 with respect to the Majority Report.

10 The Minority feels that education has flourished
11 under Article 77. If the theory of constitutional reward
12 is really the test that the Majority wants to use, then
13 they should follow their lead and stick much more closely
14 to the provisions of the existing Constitution under which
15 this education system has flourished.

16 THE CHAIRMAN: You have one minute, Delegate
17 Lord.

18 DELEGATE LORD: I think history indicates that
19 the approach of the Majority is against the best interests
20 of education in this State, and also against the best
21 interests of the people of this State.
