8 DELEGATE LORD: Dr. Pullen, I think I can best
9 answer you by quoting an eminent authority on the subject
10 of education who appeared before the Constitutional Con-
11 vention Commission and offered testimony on the subject
12 of education, and said, "Now I think when we begin to
13 write the Constitution with respect to education, we must
14 approach it from a constructive standpoint. This doesn't
15 mean a long-winded affair at all. It can be done in a very
16 few lines, but what you are doing here when you rewrite the
17 Constitution of Maryland, you are rewriting the school
18 system of Maryland."
