2 It is also a little difficult to discuss this
3 first amendment without reference to the one to follow,
4 which I believe includes the other proposition. This
5 seems to be confined pretty largely to the State insti-
6 tutions of higher learning in the second part of the
7 amendment.

8 Delegate Lord has stated in the clearest and
9 most cogent fashion the objections to the Majority Report.
10 As I see it, that report attempts to freeze in the Con-
11 stitution the managerial system as it presently exists,
12 and also attempts to give independence and physical inde-
13 pendence to at least three different State institutions of
14 higher learning.

15 That seems to me not only to violate the con-
16 stitutional principle that we should have only three
17 branches of government, but it also attempts to give
18 complete autonomy in how funds are expended to what is
19 essentially a branch of the executive government.

20 That seems to me to be very unwise, and by
21 spending money on one particular project, they make it
