

1 This is one field where the maximum flexibility
2 should exist, and it seems to me that the Minority Report
3 has met that problem in the wisest way, by stating gen-
4 erally the policies and objects of the Constitution, but
5 leaving the ultimate solution of those problems to the
6 representatives of all the people.
