5 DELEGATE ROBEY: This is surely to be commended  
6 by the Minority. I submit, however, the simple addition of  
7 this phrase does not destroy the Minority's intent nor their  
8 flexibility. This change will, however, provide great com-  
9 fort to those citizens of our State vitally interested in  
10 education, while diminishing the possibility that education  
11 will be subject to political capture. I urge the members  
12 of this Committee to accept this compromise in the light  
13 that it was fashioned.
