4 Equal opportunities for all will conserve our
5 human resources, since intelligence, ability and talent
6 are found in all economic classes. Second, educational
7 opportunities will create further taxpayers instead of
8 future Welfare clients.

9 Friends, in this 1967 Constitutional Convention
10 I would like you to remember what we plan for is not for
11 today, not for tomorrow, but for the tomorrows beyond the
12 horizon. We should not think of this equal education
13 solely from the point of the annual expense, nor solely
14 from the problems involved, but as a possible investment
15 which will resound to the benefit of the people.
