2 equal opportunity, he would not get it. He needs
3 additional opportunity, and I suggest to you that the
4 language that we are attempting to expunge from this par-
5 ticular Article is language that must not go in. It
6 will do the reverse of that which we want. We do want,
7 and I am sure all educations wants to develop to a maxi-
8 mum the individual's potentials.

9 Let us leave the Constitution free to do that,
10 with whatever expense, whatever necessary, and whatever
11 program the Board of Education sees fit to implement.
