2 with a minimum of interruption of their own committee
3 schedule. Any delegate desiring to testify before
4 another committee should contact both his own chairman
5 and the chairman of the other committee. He doesn't have
6 to do it personally. The administrative assistant can do
7 it for him. The two chairmen will then arrange a time
8 so that the delegate can be given a priority in testifying
9 before the other committee, and be absent from his own
10 committee a minimum of time.

11 One other announcement. I am quite sure that
12 everyone noticed the absence of blackeyed Susans on the
13 rostrum at the opening session. I want to assure you that
14 that was by no means an oversight of the Committee, con-
15 sisting of Delegates Murray, Clark and Rybczynski. They
