will then know how best to schedule the hearing so that
we won't have everybody there on one day, but can spread
it over and make it more practical.

This is a matter of considerable importance to many of the Counties. I would ask their delegations to cooperate and make sure that the proper people are made aware of the fact that there will be such hearings.
