3 it over and make it more practical.

4 This is a matter of considerable importance to  
5 many of the Counties. I would ask their delegations to  
6 cooperate and make sure that the proper people are made  
7 aware of the fact that there will be such hearings.

9 DELEGATE KIEFER: Mr. President, the Committee  
10 on Personal Rights and Preamble wants to be sure that  
11 the Convention has before it all the areas and the con-  
12 cept of personal rights when it considers the Declaration  
13 of Rights portion of the new Constitution; and to this end,  
14 the Committee invites and urges each delegate to present  
15 promptly any ideas <sup>OR</sup> ~~of~~ specific proposals which he or  
16 she believes deserves <sup>the Committee's</sup> ~~their~~ attention. The Committee also  
17 invites and urges any individuals, groups or organizations  
18 to do the same, with the desire that this Committee intro-  
19 duce the proposal, that it should be forwarded in writing  
20 to us as soon as possible. The Committee, of course,
