

1 reported to our Legislative Branch, and it is quite
2 obvious to our Committee that there are numerous areas
3 where we share joint interests with other committees of

6 tee. Consequently, we have taken the liberty today
7 of appointing a liaison representative from the Legis-
8 lative Branch Committee to all the other substantive
9 committees of this Constitutional Convention, with the
10 hope that the committee chairmen will do likewise, and
11 that to this particular end, we are hopeful that we can
12 work together in certain areas of mutual interest to
13 eliminate the possibility of double hearings, so that
14 when we have something of common interest with another
15 committee which will keep the difficulties of travel down
16 as far as waits are concerned; so with the permission of
17 the Chair, which hopefully we have received, we have made
18 these appointments of members of our Committee to work
19 directly with the Chairmen of the other substantive com-
20 mittees, and we look forward to perhaps similar activity
21 on the part of the substantive committees as well as with
