

1 **THE PRESIDENT:**

2 Delegate Penniman, is it correct that the Committee
3 on Style at other places is using the word "passed" instead
4 of "enacted"?

5 **DELEGATE PENNIMAN:** Mr. President, that is true,
6 yes. We have been assuming that "enacted" included the
7 enactment which makes it a law, including also the action of
8 the Governor.

9 **THE PRESIDENT:** Isn't that what is intended here?

10 I am not sure that I understand you.

11 **DELEGATE PENNIMAN:** In this particular case,
12 it should be enacted. It is quite all right to say
13 "enacted" in this case.

14 **THE PRESIDENT:** In other words, when you say
15 "law enacted by the General Assembly" you mean a law or a
16 bill "passed" by the General Assembly, and either signed
17 by the Governor or passed by the General Assembly over his
18 veto.

19 **DELEGATE PENNIMAN:** That is correct. The use of
20 the word "passed" is only prior to the action by the
21 Governor.
