by outside groups or agencies. This is only for the authority of the Convention to act. Not in any sense is it meant to be a limitation on the authority to publish.

THE PRESIDENT: I think the President ought to add to that statement for certainty and for emphasis. All Convention records in the opinion of the President, and this is the policy uniformly followed, are public records. The official journal, that is the original notes of the Journal Clerk, have been microfilmed each dav and are in the Hall of Records where, of course, they are always available to the public. The files of the Convention and of all of the Committees will be turned over ultimately to the Hall of Records where they will, of course, always be available to the public.

The Archives has already put in motion plans to collect all of the documents from the various committees, all the files of the officers and all of the official papers of the Convention. These are being catalogued and boxed for delivery to the Hall of Records so that I would anticipate that within thirty days after the
