1 Delegate Chabot. 2 DELEGATE CHABOT: Is it possible as a result 3 of 3.21 for a bill to be passed in joint session? DELEGATE PENNIMAN: It is passed by the majority 5 of the members of each House. I don't think we made any 6 substantive change. A vote in joint session or in either House on any bill or resolution or for the election or 7 8 confirmation of any state officer shall be taken only in 9 public session. 10 THE PRESIDENT: Delegate Penniman, the Chair 11 is a little disturbed by that change. I am not sure that 12 it wouldn't at least raise a question. DELEGATE PENNIMAN: I see the problem. I suggest 13 we strike the change in line 5 to make certain that there 14 is no possibility of that. 15 THE PRESIDENT: You would also restore the "that" 16 in line 7? 17 DELEGATE PENNIMAN: Yes, it would be both in 18 line 7 and line 5. 19 THE PRESIDENT: Is there any objection to 20 modifying the recommendations of the Committee so as to 21
