1 successor of whom, but in the other situations the "as 2 qualified" language meets the problem perfectly well. THE PRESIDENT: Delegate Bamberger. DELEGATE BAMBERGER: Mr. President, I would like to object belatedly to changing the title of 3.19. 5 deals more specifically with laws. The more important provisions of 3.19 relate to the bill after it is enacted, particularly the last part of that paragraph. 8 9 DELEGATE PENNIMAN: Delegate Bamberger would be correct if he noted that the word "bills" is not to be 10 found in that particular section -- excuse me. 11 THE PRESIDENT: There is an objection made to 12 the proposed modification. In the absence of an amendment, 13 we would have to revert to the style proposed in the 14 Committee report. 15 Anyone desire -- well, we will come to that 16 later, unless you desire, Delegate Penniman, to suggest, 17 even though it is a departure from the usual rule that you 18 use both words. 19 DELEGATE PENNIMAN: I have no objection either 20 way. 21
