

1 DELEGATE BURDETTE: If we were trying to save
2 the constitutional status of the concurrent power, we
3 would probably need to get the power somewhere more
4 closely to the General Assembly.

5 Now, I wonder, that is, what we are trying to
6 say is the General Assembly acting by law. I frankly
7 think that the amendment can be construed to reverse the
8 language which is here.

9 THE PRESIDENT: Delegate Marion.

10 DELEGATE MARION: Is what you are suggesting
11 that the words, "by law", be located at some other
12 point in the sentence?

13 THE PRESIDENT: Delegate Burdette.

14 DELEGATE BURDETTE: Yes, exactly.

15 THE PRESIDENT: Where?

16 DELEGATE BURDETTE: I should like to get the
17 concept, the General Assembly shall have concurrent power
18 by law, moved into --

19 THE PRESIDENT: Could you do it better by
20 saying you would regulate by law?
