7 DELEGATE BURDETTE: Mr. President, I should
8 like to say for the record what may to some of you be
9 somewhat unusual.

10 At the close of the meetings of the Constitution-
11 al Convention Commission I was able to say the same thing
12 that I can now say about the Convention; that although I
13 have received mail and telegrams and other written communi-
14 cations, and I have heard here some discussions of pressure
15 or other forces brought upon some delegates, I can say,
16 sir, no person save a delegate or delegates has ever asked
17 for my vote, either in the Commission or this Convention.
