the conclusion, which we do not find to be one even in
the gray area, we say it is perfectly clear, that we don't

need this provision in the Constitution.

However, for fear that if we left it out, somebody might raise the point and say this Convention met, considered the matter, and left it out because they didn't think that such sslary should be so reduced, we offer this report to make it perfectly clear that it is our intention not in any way to upset the present prevailing law, and that is everybody is going to be treated alike where these taxes are concerned, whether your salaries are fixed, whether they are not subject to diminution, taxes are taxes, and all will have to pay them within the requirements of the law.

What we are asking is that this report be accepted and adopted and filed in the records of this Convention.

I so move, Mr. Chairman.

THE CHAIRMAN: Are there any questions for purposes of clarification? Is there a second to the motion? This is a committee report and needs no second.
