The English Parliament and the Legislatures of many of the American States enacted legislation to enable those believers, conscientiously scrupulous of taking the oath and to qualify therefor as witnesses by affirmation.

State constitutional provisions similarly provided for the affirmation as an oath substitute in a variety of instances.

The oath is identical, as we present it, with the draft and existing Constitution, in the essential areas to support the Constitution of the United States. to be faithful and bear true allegiance to the State of Maryland, and to support the Constitution and laws thereof.

The proposed oath that we present to you differs. however, from the existing Constitution only in the last part, where it delineates, or deletes the provision that a Governor, a Senator, a member of the House of Delegates or Judge will not directly or indirectly receive profits from any part of the profits of any other office during
