probably stand subject to correction, but this is just my 1 thought. I think this is the State Constitution. I think 2 this would probably be my second guess on it. 3 THE CHAIRMAN: Any further questions for pur-4 poses of clarification? Delegate Rybczynski? 5 DELEGATE RYBCZYNSKI: Mr. Chairman, at what 6 point, or let me ask you this question a little differ-7 ently, was there a time when the oath contained a reference 8 9 to the Deity? DELEGATE BOYER: Not in our consideration, we 10 didn't ever hold that per se. 11 DELEGATE RYBCZYNSKI: In the history of the 12 State, has the oath ever referred to the Deity? 13 DELEGATE BOYER: My recollection on research 14 is that Maryland's maiden Constitution was silent on 15 this point. I am not quite sure of what the 1864 Consti-16 tution had. I don't know. 17 DELEGATE RYBCZYNSKI: If I may continue, in the 18 Commission Report, on Page 303, in Section 6 there is no 19 reference to the Deity, and I was wondering if that is 20 because it was never referred to in the first place, the
